5 great takes on TACOS and BURRITOS

But don't neglect the *birria* ramen. A cross between *birria* taco and ramen, it's another item you can't live without once you try it. And then there's the *birria* smash sandwich.

2 LA SANTA TAQUERIA

Go for Taco Tuesday, when most of the items (except for the seafood) come three to an order instead of in pairs. It's difficult to choose between meats – except if you're vegetarian. But don't worry, you're covered too, with mushrooms, quinoa, and cauliflower tacos.

3 TAQUERÍA LOS NOPALES

4 TACOS VS BURRITOS CANTINA
