Cook and pastry chef Dorothea Malmegård and her husband run DoMa on Nybrogatan. There are very few places that succeed in combining such a laidback atmosphere with great personal style. The restaurant is literally an extension of their living room as they live in the same building and used to host brunch-supper clubs in their flat before deciding to open a restaurant.

5 iconic CONTEMPORARY BUILDINGS

261 AULA MEDICA

AT: KAROLINSKA INSTITUTET

Gert Wingårdh is the famous architect who created Aula Medica, the Karolinska Institutet's lecture hall complex. The architectural landmark is situated on the border between the city and Solna. The building's slightly curved façade with a surface layer consisting of various coloured triangular glass elements is one of the building's stand-out design features.



262 ARKITEKTURSKOLAN

The School of Architecture has received several awards over the years. Tham & Videgård designed the ovoid building's exterior in glass and a deep red Corten steel in a nod to the dark red brick façades of the surrounding, older buildings on the KTH Campus.

263 STOCKHOLM WATERFRONT

Distinctive contemporary architecture tends to stir up emotions. But most people agree that White Arkitekter did an excellent job creating this energy-efficient building with an iconic, asymmetric, stainless steel façade.

264 SVEN-HARRY'S KONSTMUSEUM

How can you overlook this five-floor building, clad in a gold-tinted copper-aluminium-zinc alloy? Nicknamed Guldhuset or 'The Golden House', this spectacular, square building houses an art gallery, a museum and a restaurant, among other things. It was designed by Gert Wingårdh and Anna Höglund of Wingårdh Architects.

265 STRÖMKAJEN'S FERRY TERMINAL BUILDINGS

When Marge Arkitekter received the commission to build the ferry terminal buildings at Strömkajen, they had to take due account of the site's central location. They created three cone-shaped, sculptural buildings in burnished tombak, that do not detract the attention from the nearby landmarks.

5 FASCINATING CEMETERIES

316 ADOLF FREDRIKS KYRKOÅRD

The Adolf Fredrik Church in the city centre is known for its fine works of art and the graves of many prominent Swedes in this cemetery. Here you can find the graves of Swedish Prime Minister Hjalmar Branting's and that of Prime Minister Olof Palme, who was assassinated in 1986, just a block away from the church.

317 KATARINA KYRKOÅRD

Saint Catherine's Church in Södermalm was rebuilt twice after being destroyed by fire, the second time was in the 1990s. Several famous Swedes are buried in the cemetery surrounding the church. Many of their graves are located along the main gravel road.

318 NORRA BEGRAVNINGS- PLATSEN

One of the country's largest burial grounds is Norra begravningsplatsen in Solna, which dates from the 1900s and is the burial site of several authors, politicians and scientists. When you take a stroll among the graves, you will recognise the names of many Nobel Prize winners, including that of Alfred Nobel himself.

319 SKOGSKYRKOÅRDEN

The UNESCO World Heritage Woodland Cemetery is a major cemetery and an architectural masterpiece. The famous architects Gunnar Asplund and Sigurd Lewerentz received the commission to design it in 1915. Its chapels, crematorium and tranquil landscape design reflect the evolution from Nordic Classicism to mature Functionalism.

320 MOSAISKA BEGRAVNINGS- PLATSEN ARONSBERG

This Jewish cemetery in Kungsholmen, which is surrounded by apartment buildings, is so well hidden that passers-by and even the locals are sometimes surprised to see it is there. The Mosaic Aronsberg burial site was founded in 1776 and is named after Aaron Isaac, the first Jew who was allowed to settle in Sweden without renouncing his Jewish faith.





363 **KRONBERGS ATELJÉ**

A common misconception is that the open-air museum and zoo Skansen is all about animals, but the buildings here are just as intriguing. A yellow house from 1912 is particularly interesting. This was the famous painter Julius Kronberg's studio, where the pop group ABBA shot the cover for their last album, *Visitors*, in 1981.



456 NORRA DJURGÅRDEN

Norra Djurgården ⑨

You can enter the green area of Norra Djurgården from different directions. Either you start at Stadion and jog through Lill-Janskogen, or you start from Ropsten, Hjorthagen or Universitetet. Regardless, you will run through lush woodland, past towering oak trees, up and down steep hills.

457 TANTOLUNDEN

One of the city's largest parks is located in the southeastern part of Södermalm. Tantolunden was established around the turn of the last century and developed into a popular meeting spot for people of all ages. Combine jogging with exercises in the wooden outdoor gym and finish your work-out with a dip in Lake Årstaviken.

458 HAGAPARKEN

This is Stockholm's very own Hyde Park. Inspired by English landscape gardens, the park is also home to several royal buildings and the special Copper Tents. Enjoy the nature and the historical architecture while running around Haga or take the long run lap around nearby Brunnsviken.

459 RÅLAMBSHOVS-PARKEN



The running trail around Riddarfjärden is unbeatable. Covering a distance of roughly 7 kilometres, it winds its way past the Old Town, Söder Mälärstrand, Västerbron and Kungsholmen, offering views of the glittering water wherever you are. Rålambshovsparken is a good place to start as it has an outdoor gym where you can warm up.

460 DJURGÅRDEN ISLAND

Djurgården used to be the King's hunting grounds. Situated across the water, within view of the Royal Palace, this lush island is a firm favourite with Stockholmers. Besides museums and cafes, you'll also find a 10-kilometre running trail along the shoreline, with oak trees and pretty meadows.

481 **THE SQUARE**
2017

Ruben Östlund's satirical drama about a curator of a contemporary art museum in Stockholm is an unusual work with challenging themes that won a Golden Palm in Cannes. Odenplan, Central Station and The Royal Palace's outer courtyard play a key role in this acclaimed film.

482 **KÄRLEK & ANARKI**
2020

Kärlek & Anarki is a comedy-drama series by Lisa Langseth. It follows the lives of Sofie, a married consultant, and Max, a young IT technician, as they engage in an unexpected flirt at the publishing house where they work. The series showcases iconic Stockholm locations such as Sergels torg, Lärkstana, and Kungsträdgården.

483 **STOCKHOLM STORIES**
2014

Directed by Karin Fahlén, *Stockholm Stories* is a multi-plot drama about five people whose paths cross during a few rainy days in November. In this contemporary comedy, the characters visit several places that you'll recognise, from Gondolen, Hötorgsskraporna and Millesgården to the Parliament House.

484 **SUMMER WITH MONIKA**
1953

Experience the Swedish summer in the archipelago in black and white in this Ingmar Bergman film from 1953. Two working-class teenagers start a passionate love affair and steal a boat to be with one another during an idyllic summer. Things do not turn out as planned when autumn arrives.

485 **WE ARE THE BEST!**
2013

Lukas Moodysson's drama from 2013 is a lovely nostalgic trip back to the eighties. In a heartfelt and hilarious story about the teenage years, this film follows three rebellious girls in 1982 Stockholm who decide to form a punk band, despite being told by everyone that punk is dead.
